## **POSTION SUMMARY**

The Naturalist is both a student and teacher of nature and is responsible for teaching educational sessions on a variety of topics relating to Holden's environment. They help support Holden's environmental education mission by presenting to adults and children of all ages.

**MAJOR FUNCTIONS** (principal duties and responsibilities; such as categories supported, staff size, volume managed, etc)

Specific responsibilities include but are not limited to the following:

- Aims to support Holden's vision, mission and core values in providing environmental education to all guests, children, and staff.
- Integrate the study of nature with other aspects of guest and staff programming.
- Develops resources for guests to help orient their understanding of the valley and Holden's environmental practices.
- Examines and make recommendations to management in order to improve our environmental stewardship and practices.
- Seeks to bring staff and guests to a better understanding and appreciation for nature and environmental stewardship.
- Teaches educational sessions and conducts tours on a variety of topics relating to hiking and to Holden's environment such as: Holden Village's Mine Remediation, Tree Identification, Holden's Environmental Ethics, Geology of the North Cascades, 10 Essentials, Leave No Trace Principles, Backpacking Basics to other areas of interest/expertise etc.

- Works across teams to provide educational opportunities to Holden guests and staff and the youth programs.
- Plans & leads structured hikes and programs.

**KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS REQUIREMENTS** (position specifications; such as knowledge/education, skills, problem solving/decision making, risk/bottom line results, management responsibility – people and functions)

Specific knowledge and skills include but are not limited to the following:

- Strong organizational, communication and leadership skills must be an engaging speaker willing to learn and teach new material and develop sessions according to Village interest.
- Holden trail experience and first-aid and/or wilderness training preferred.
- Knowledge of the Railroad Creek Valley, experience in outdoor adventure, or a background in biology/environmental science or a related field required.
- Ability to work outdoors.
- Excellent communication skills and demonstrated ability to communicate well with individuals of all ages and backgrounds.
- Experience with supervision, giving direction, and/or managing a project.
- Ability to take initiative, work independently and creatively, and collaborate with other teams.
- A sincere love of nature and desire to learn and to share information with others is required.

**COMMUNITY EXPECTATIONS** (particular knowledge/skills related to client and/or agency needs)

- Enthusiasm for and ability to work in a remote wilderness setting.
- Pledges to work in ways that support and fulfill Holden Village's <u>Mission, Vision, and</u> <u>Values</u> and commits to the terms of the <u>Community of Practice Agreement</u>.
- Abides by Holden Village's Community Health Protocols and Practices.
- Extends genuine hospitality to all villagers.
- Upholds and works to further Holden Village values of diversity, equality, respect, sustainability, and spirituality as articulated in the <u>Strategic Plan</u>.
